Entry must include at least two programs outlined under the VA& R committee. **Juanita Lochner** award – the Junior group reporting the most outstanding service benefitting our hospitalized veterans. **Diane Gerber** award – to a Junior or Senior member who reports the best overall program aiding and assisting a Veteran, the **Linda Tome award** to the Unit submits the largest single donation to Stop Soldiers Suicide. There is also an award from Department for the **best Unit** report and the **best County** report on a year-round program. For National awards please see the Plan of Action.

I look forward to receiving your final year-end report May 1, 2021. Please make sure you are reporting on the 2020-2021 form!

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Spring has finally arrived. I hope your units were able to plan activities for Children and Youth in your community. As the weather, gets warmer it will be easier to do socially distanced activities outside.

This pandemic has increased feelings of isolation and loneliness in our children. They cannot visit family or play with friends. Many schools are virtual. This not only limits socialization but in some families, they may be subject to increased abuse. They have little or no contact with teachers who would notice the signs of mental or emotional distress. Acts thoughts of suicide have not only increased but are affecting younger children.

So how can we help? Contact your school to collaborate with programs to boost children's self-esteem. Some schools have a designated safe area where students can go as an indication they are in need of emotional support.

Buddy benches are an example. The primary goal of a Buddy Bench is to help children avoid feelings of loneliness and isolation. Recess may provide socialization with peers, but for the child who is left out of the group, feelings of isolation escalate. Sitting on this bench indicates they want and need someone to talk to. Sometimes a simple conversation, a friendly voice, can make a world of difference.

Whatever activities you can provide would help. Don't forget to report these activities. I know some Posts were closed and Units have not held meetings. But whatever you can do will be greatly appreciated.

One last reminder, award deadlines are rapidly approaching. Review available awards in plan of action or department website. What a great way to celebrate all you do.

# Constitution and Bylaws/Resolutions......Marie Mock, Chairperson

Spring has sprung, and we are looking forward to our Department Convention. I will be presenting two resolutions for your consideration. Please be sure to read them carefully when you get your Convention call as you will need to discuss them in preparation for having your representative cast your vote at Convention. I think they give us some flexibility that is necessary as we face the uncertainties of a world where a pandemic such as we are facing can turn things upside down in a heartbeat.

At the unit level, some of our units are adjusting to Zoom or hybrid or in person meetings. Whatever format you are using, be sure to include as many of your members as possible. Our units work best when everyone feels important and listened to. Call members that you have not heard from to make sure that they feel valued and included. The best governing documents are useless if they do not have the support of the governed. The Department cannot make people follow the rules. We can only encourage and offer support. We are a grass roots organization, and only, as such, will we be successful. Individuals are the source of power and action so be sure to listen to what they are saying.

If you are planning to revise your documents, please try to get them in before the change of leadership so you do not find yourself waiting for approval while the new administration gets underway. We hope to have a smooth transition, but there is no need to test that by adding the stress of changing your ruling papers at the same time that you and the Department are changing your leaders. Since everyone votes on the rules, there should be no problem changing leaders but getting them approved early may make things smoother in the long run.

I want to remind you also that the Department cannot arbitrate on Standing Rules that have not been submitted for approval. Some units and counties have asked for intervention where the Department has no record of the rules being approved. If you want the Department to help settle disputes, we must have proof that you followed the proper procedure so that we know that the rules were in line with the Department and National Constitutions

and Bylaws. Standing Rules, other than number one and two which address dues are not required but do take away the annoyance of voting on every single repetitive action. If you have additional Standing Rules, they do need to be approved by the Department.

Do not let these scholarships go unawarded in the future. Keep the future Department Education Chairman busy. Help seniors apply for this scholarship in the future.

Thank you for your continued support and for all that you do at a Unit, County, and District Level! EACH OF YOU is why this program can be a success each and every year!

The ALA EGS leadership team is committed to give this year's citizens an ALA EGS session to remember, just like any other year.

We thank you for your patience and your commitment to this wonderful program!

This month, our focus is on audits. Books for both Units and Counties should be audited no less often than once a year. Some Unit Bylaws specify more frequent audits – if yours does, follow the timeline set by your Bylaws.

How to begin? What do you need?

- The Audit Committee typically appointed by the President, unless your Bylaws specify a different method, and generally an odd number of individuals (usually 3)
- A copy of the budget
- A copy of the minutes for all meetings since the previous audit date
- The Treasurer's books
- The checkbook(s)
- Bank statements for all accounts checking, savings, CDs, or other investments

The Audit Committee should meet with the Treasurer to confirm the following:

- Poppy funds and General funds are recorded separately, with the income and expenses for each fund properly accounted for.
- Income has been received as expected from all budgeted sources. You should note significant discrepancies, both over and under the budgeted amounts.
- All mandatory fees and budgeted expenses have been paid as budgeted. Again, you want to note significant discrepancies, both over and under the budgeted amounts.
- Funds have been spent as specified in any motions for expenditure of funds.
- Bank statements have been reconciled and accurately reflect the activity and balance(s) in the checkbook(s) and other bank/investment statements.

The Audit Committee should report to the Unit. If there are no issues, your report may simply state that the books have been audited and found to be in order.

If you have questions about the audit or the processes, please don't hesitate to contact any one of us on the Finance/Audit Committee – we are here to help!

Parliamentarian......Patricia Hennessy, Chairperson

As this administrative year comes to a close, please remember the following important items when scheduling your unit and county elections:

**Quorum**. A quorum is the minimum number of unit members who must be present at a meeting to legally transact business and on the county level it is the minimum number of units present. This number is set by your unit or county Constitution & Bylaws. Any business transacted in the absence of a quorum is invalid.

**Notice.** Members are entitled to notice of all meetings and elections. Certain important actions require that additional notice be given to all members that a particular topic will be discussed. For example, to discipline or expel an officer requires advance notice. The lack of appropriate previous notice makes such actions invalid. Proper notice must also be given for meetings of shareholders and boards of directors, and the lack of such notice can invalidate the entire meeting and all votes.

**Vote.** Units, Counties, Districts and Department make decisions by voting. However, the vote required on a specific matter depends on the action to be taken. For example, some motions require a majority vote and some require a two-third's vote. An improper vote makes any action ineffectual and can lead to lawsuits.

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In August 2019, at our last National Convention in Indianapolis, 2 changes were made to the awards under the PPP Committee. Starting with 2021-2022 administrative year, the Unit Member of the Year award will be under the Leadership Committee, and the Salute to Servicewomen awards will be under the National Security Committee. The National organization will no longer have a Past Presidents Parley Committee. Please continue to look for new leaders and continue to mentor our current members. As Past Presidents our job doesn't end; it just changes a little bit.

Thank you all for your service to our organization.

### **Refreshing your Online Presence**

Navigating your unit through the pandemic has created many difficult obstacles for all of us. It has also afforded us the opportunity to take a look at our online presence and work to develop content for our social media accounts or to redesign our website.

Have you visited the National American Legion Auxiliary website?

If you enter that into your browser it will redirect you to a new national website that has a new look and a new rebranded focus! Here are a few things to consider when refreshing your use of web-based platforms to promote the work of the auxiliary that will help freshen up your media presence.

#### Do more than just promote your events.

Consider sharing the success of a program using pictures will draw people in and make the event come to life. It will also inspire people to get involved in future events within the organization.

### Spotlight the members themselves.

Our members have more dedication, energy, and heart than most people in the community. They are also usually involved in more than just the auxiliary. Giving them a moment to shine like a "Sunday spotlight" or "Woman Wednesday" by highlighting their role in your organization, their contributions to your community, and their professional networks will increase your momentum on social media/website by encouraging others from those parts of their life to interact with your content.

#### Be predictable.

Map out a plan for content. Pick a day each week you know you will post new content. Maybe you do a Sunday spotlight, Tuesday tips, and Friday fun post. Generate content that can support the members through Tuesday tips and find ways for members to interact in a social setting on Fridays. If you do this weekly, members will begin to check the website in a predictable manner seeking out the new content and then when something posts on an off day it will peak their interest.

### Utilize your junior members.

These ladies are living their best lives on social media. Let them help you but be careful not to relinquish control to all of them as they are still learning about boundaries on social media. There are endless trends that come and go on social media and your juniors can help you ride the wave of enthusiasm with it. Don't be afraid to learn the newest tic tock dance and post it on your social media. You don't know who might watch it and get a chuckle about it and think- this looks like a group of people who might have fun.

I encourage you to explore the fresh new national website and let it inspire you to talk with your members with ways you might refresh your unit's digital footprint! Consider these tips and strategies as a way to improve your presence and attract new members while keeping your current members engaged!

Warriors Family Assistance is a grass roots effort of the American Legion Auxiliary. It gives us an opportunity to open our hearts and make a difference in the lives of our veterans and their families.

Auxiliary members believe in this program and continue to actively publicize the program by distributing brochures in their communities, Posts and VA clinics. With the generosity of these grants, our veterans, military, and their families can receive the resources they need in a timely manner. The challenges of the pandemic continue to disrupt our lives and the Auxiliary is always present to reach out to our veterans and ask if help is needed.

As you begin nominations and elections within your Units and Counties, please remember to include the position of Chairman for the Warriors Family Assistance Committee. The success of this program begins at the Unit and County level.

As a reminder, WFA grants are available to currently deployed military and their families and those honorably discharged within the last ten years. National Guard and Reservists who have been federally deployed within the past ten years are also eligible. A non-payable grant of up to \$1200 is available for Maintenance, Medical or Employment requests. A review panel of three members at the County or District level is required to interview the applicant.

As we are winding down this 2020-2021 administrative year, discuss making a donation with your Unit so that a fund balance will be carried forward and used for future grants. This program assists our veterans; therefore, your Poppy funds can be used to make donations. Your Unit can be eligible for the Linda Moseman Award for the largest single donation to the WFA program by May 1st. Category 1: Units with membership of 10-99 Members; Category 2: Units with membership of 100 plus members. I am thankful for your support of the WFA program. You are the key to its success.

- Important reminder: Close of Books will be Monday, June 14, 2021, therefore, all membership dues for 2021 must be received no later than Thursday, June 10<sup>th</sup> in order to be processed and counted towards your goal. <u>Please DO NOT hold membership</u>, send it in promptly so it can be processed in a timely manner.
- Each District President has a Zoom account for the use of scheduling District, County or Unit meetings. All you have to do is contact your respective District President and she can set up the meeting for you.
- The District President will also be setting up the District Caucuses prior to Department Convention via a Zoom meeting. Please contact your District President for details. Spring Conferences are also being set up via Zoom and a few are in person. Please contact your District President for the dates.
- 2022 UNIT DATA FORM FOR DIRECT BILLING also known as the BLUE FORM was mailed out to all units February 12<sup>th</sup> and is also available on the Department Website under the Resource tab under forms. (Type or Print Non-legible or incomplete forms will be returned). The dues amount listed on the form will be printed on the upcoming Membership Renewal Notices (2022) that will be mailed, by

National Headquarters to all members in September 2021 and then again in January 2022.

As of April 19, 2021 there are still 203 units that did not send back their "Blue Form". YOU MUST RETURN THIS FORM EVEN IF THERE ARE NO CHANGES THIS IS A MANDATORY FORM AND MUST BE RETURNED BY DUE DATE OF MAY 1, 2021.

- Currently, Units are NOT able to pay their Unit (multiple members) dues online like the American Legion and SAL's. Individual members can log onto their account on my Auxiliary member portal and pay their due online to National. If a family has more than one person to pay, they can call National HQ at (317) 569-4500 and do so. Once a member has paid their dues, they can now log onto their member portal—print off their membership card, update their information, as well as all the resources that are available to members.
- **Membership updates** As a reminder, membership totals are updated each week by the Department Office on Wednesday. If you need up-to-date membership totals, you can email the office or call the Department office for up-to-date numbers for your unit and/or county meeting.
- Please do not send DD214's into the office with applications. Once the Post Adjutant/Officer signs
  the application, return the supporting documents to the member. The office only needs the completed –
  signed application with the dues and transmittal.
- Members if you move, change any contact information, phone numbers, emails, etc., please send the change to the Department office so your information is updated in a timely manner. This also pertains to unit President, Membership Chair and Unit Treasurer
