# -----Message from the Department Office-----

 National will be printing the 2024 Membership cards and rosters on April 1, 2023. This means that any changes, new members, rejoins and transfers made after April 1<sup>st</sup> will not be reflected on the Unit's 2024 membership cards and rosters. This does NOT mean we will stop accepting 2023 dues. We process renewals/new members ALL year; please do not hold onto it until the Fall.

- The 2024 Unit Data form for renewal notices will be mailed to Unit Presidents by .the end of the month. It will be available as a fillable PDF to download off of our website under the membership tab. Make sure you are using the 2024 form only. Please complete the entire form and do no leave anything blank. This form is due back to the Department Office no later than <u>May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023</u>. Please remember that the new rates will take affect with the 2024 dues that will be available to pay in July 2023. If your current rate is not sufficient, please make sure your unit notifies all members that there will be a dues increase proposed for the unit, when the meeting will be held, etc. Please make sure you follow your unit Constitution & Bylaws regarding notice to all members.
- The 2024 per capita for Department and National for senior members is \$28; the junior per capita is staying the same at \$6.25. If you do not submit your form by May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 and your current rate is below the amounts above, the Unit will not receive a portion of the per capita for 2024. Once the rates are locked and it needs to be changed, National will charge a processing fee.
- At this time, the current year (2023) dues have to be paid first before back dues. This now includes 2022 dues.
- Please do not send DD214's/active-duty documentation into the office with applications. Once the Post Adjutant/Officer signs the application and the membership chair (ALA) verifies all supporting documents, return the supporting documents to the member. The office only needs the completed signed application with the dues and transmittal. Remember if the veteran is living, he/she must be a current paid member in the American Legion. Remember to check off which era the veteran served and the relationship of the veteran to the ALA applicant. Please circle the appropriate relationship to the veteran.
- Applications need to be complete and legible otherwise they will be returned to the unit membership chair. New members address needs to be complete. No abbreviations on city/town. All membership applications must be presented to the unit membership chairman with the proper documentation prior to being submitted to the office for processing.
- **Membership chairs** if your unit members move, change any contact information, phone numbers, emails, etc., please send the change to the Department office so the information is updated in a timely manner. This also pertains to unit President, Membership Chair and Unit Treasurer.
- Newsletters E-mail copies of the Newsletter are available to any member wanting a free copy. Please e-mail anyone of us at the office with a valid email and we will get you on the list. If you do not have email and someone in the unit/county would like to receive it on your behalf, please let us know so we can add them to the list. If you receive a copy of the newsletter via email, please share it with the members in your unit or county. Mailed copies of the Newsletters are available at the cost of \$15.00 per year.
- All Department issued checks must be deposited within 90 days. Going forward the treasurer will not reissue checks that were not deposited in a timely manner.

- All checks sent to the office should be made out as follows: American Legion Auxiliary, Department of New York and indicate in the memo line what it is for. Also, please remember to sign the check.
- All donations should be sent to the department office and not the committee chair.
- When submitting a donation form please indicate what unit or county it is.
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Congratulations to the fifty-two units who have reached or exceeded one hundred percent of their unit membership objective. Currently the Fifth District is in first place, with 86.07% paid members. At county level Livingston County is in first place with 93.285% paid members, great job.

Department of New York also has a membership challenge; the first Department to reach 100% receives a \$25.00 donation to Girl's State program. Current standings are New York 84.21% with Massachusetts at 75.97%. We are almost there. Let's go New York I know we can do it.

Thank you to all the unit and county membership chairmen for all your dedicated hours. But we still have work to do. There are eight units who have not submitted any dues to date. We need to reach out to members who have not yet renewed. They may have just forgot, or there are underlying circumstances that maybe your unit could help by paying their dues for this year.

As warmer weather approaches think of ways your unit can recruit new members also. Some events that have been reported are setting up membership table while distributing Poppies, or unit events, how about Paint n Sip party, they are very popular. Just a reminder I need photos pertaining to membership. It could simply be a photo of new member signing an application, a dinner or event honoring members who paid by certain date. Please email or snail mail original photos to me or include as an attachment.

Also, PUFL applications for members who would like to pay a onetime fee based or your current units' dues.

The following is a recent release I recently received from our National Americanism Chairman. "Wearing an article of clothing does not count toward volunteer hours, much like hours spent flying a flag in your front yard doesn't count. Volunteer hours should reflect direct mission service and direct impact in your community. Wearing red on Fridays to show your support of our military and veterans is important and encouraged, but it ultimately has little to do with direct mission outreach. Volunteer hours are reported to Congress via The American Legion. Our impact numbers (aka your hours) need to reflect our actual hands-on mission outreach, as Congress uses those numbers when considering funding in the veterans' realm. So, by reporting non-service (i.e., wearing a shirt for 8 hours), it misrepresents the actual hours serving veterans' needs in your community and could ultimately hurt further federal funding as it looks like we are meeting the needs without that additional funding. Being branded or wearing red on Fridays is truly for awareness of veterans and the mission of the ALA, but it's just not something that should be reported in your volunteer hours."

Some dates coming up you can help promote Americanism include: February 20 Presidents Day, March 3 National anthem Day, March 13 National K9 Veterans Day, March 25 National Medal of Honor Day, March 29 National Vietnam War Veterans Day, April 5 Gold Star Spouses Day, April 9 National Former Prisoner of War Recognition Day and May 29 Memorial Day

I hope that many units have been promoting the American Legion Auxiliary Americanism Essay contest. All submissions must be received by March 15, 2023 so that I have enough time for my judges to read all of the submissions, select the divisional winners, and forward them to the National Eastern division Chairman.

#### Constitution and Bylaws/Resolutions......Sally Johnston, Chairperson

Since our last Newsletter, I have received several Constitution & Bylaws (C&B) along with Standing Rules to be reviewed. However, I need your help. It's apparent that there is still some question as to what needs to be forwarded to me as your C&B Chairman for review.

Standing Rules seem to be the biggest issue. Remember that Standing Rules are those events/items in which your Unit / County / District vote on at the beginning of an administrative year to be followed throughout the year. They are Rules that state a "specific" content, such as "the unit will pay up to \$150.00 for 3 members to attend Mid-winter Conference, funds to come from the General Fund."

I have received several Standing Rules that do not begin with #3 following the Department Standing Rules, #1 and #2, Senior and Junior dues, respectively. Many have forwarded a separate document on the Unit's letterhead. Simply begin your Units Standing Rules with #3. Beware not to repeat items that are already in the Constitution & Bylaws.

(Meeting is the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday of the month at 7pm). That is already covered in the Bylaws.

Standing Rules are intended to simplify and save time at a Unit meeting. Several Units have forwarded as many as 40 Standing Rules. Many of those where duplication of the C&B.

Additionally, we must remember we cannot make a Standing Rules that states a member "WILL OR IS REQUIRED" to do thus or so. We are all volunteers and though we would like to see someone "pay" "X" for a phone going off during a meeting, we really can't enforce it.

Also, "gender" terminology is missing. I realize that we are used to a "female" population but remember we may have "male members" in our Units and need to be addressed accordingly.

We got off to a slow start this year with this committee. However, there is still plenty of time to make your submissions for my review. I have had to send several back, which is not cost effective for all involved. My plea is that you review and review again before you send anything to me. The Postal Service is very slow, only open 4 hours a day.

When you are filling out your Transmittal Sheet which needs to be included with your submission, please be sure that the contact information is correct, especially the email address. I've had some emails returned.

I have received notification from the National Organization that I will have to provide a "Year End Report." Please provide me with any activities that you may have regarding the C&B Committee. Maybe you had or will have a workshop. Maybe you provided a skit to practice parliamentary procedure. Maybe you held "mock" elections skit. Let me know. Thank you in advance and I look forward to submitting a unique report from the state of New York.

Remember, your interviews and selection of your citizen(s) and alternate(s) should be made by March 1st! Don't forget that many schools have a winter break in February, and you will need to factor that into your interview timeline. Units should have all materials to the County ALA EGS Chairman by March 15th and the County ALA EGS Chairman should have all materials to our ALA EGS Registrar, Claire, by March 31st!

Please select Alternate Candidates! Even though your quota may have been reduced in 2023, it does not mean that you shouldn't select Alternates! So many of our Alternates move up to Citizens before ALA EGS begins! So if you have more High Schools in your County or more Units in your County than slots, select candidates from each Unit and/or High School. Make a decision on who is a Citizen and who is an Alternate. Remember....Alternates most often become Citizens.

"Morale Reflects Leadership." -Dr. Brad Johnson

The 2023 ALA Mid-Winter Conference was different and provided many different opportunities for many of our members. As with any change, there were some areas to improve upon and grow in, but overall, members were enthusiastic about the learning that occurred, the opportunities to collaborate they had, and the interactive workshops that left them inspired to continue the work of the ALA. Whether it was through a workshop, time collaborating with new

friends, or the Picasso-like art created at the Paint n Sip fundraiser, the 2023 ALA Mid-Winter Conference had a positive impact on the morale of the 225+ members in attendance.

Every time members of the American Legion Auxiliary organization come together for a meeting; we recite the preamble as a group. In it, we express our "devotion to mutual helpfulness." Still, we have all had moments in our ALA journey that haven't always felt as if others were devoted to the members and the mission, and other times that it most certainly did not feel like people were being helpful. So how do we overcome that? By looking at our leadership at the local, county, district, and state level. The quote above by Dr. Brad Johnson reflects just how vital those leaders are in impacting morale. Each one of us has an obligation to each other to lead in a way that promotes and fosters positive morale. We can do that in a few important ways.

- 1. **Encourage Understanding.** Take 5 minutes before jumping into the pomp and circumstance of the formal meeting structures to do some get-to-know-you activities. Gauge how your members feel about life and the work you are doing within the ALA to know how to proceed with the meeting. Knowing each other more personally and taking the time to learn about each other will help people work through disagreements and conflicts as they arise during meeting discussions.
- 2. **Encourage Education.** American Legion Auxiliary Senior Auxiliary Basics is a course on the leadership section of alaforveterans.org that is free to all senior members that focus on the organization's history and legacy. Learn more below!
  - a. <u>What</u>: The Senior Auxiliary Basics Course teaches members about our organization, history, basic protocol, and basic conduct of business through a self-paced study course.
  - b. <u>Who:</u> Every member is encouraged to enhance her membership by expanding her knowledge of the organization. The Auxiliary Basics Course is designed and available for any member in good standing.
  - c. <u>Why</u>: A good strong organization is comprised of knowledgeable members. The more you know, the more informed you are concerning the mission of our organization, how best to accomplish our tasks, and how you are an integral part in the success of the organization.
  - d. <u>Where:</u> Take the course in the comfort of your home, with your Auxiliary sisters, at a meeting, or in a classroom session.
  - e. <u>How</u>: There are two methods to participate in this course. You may choose to read the material, then answer the test questions, or you may wish to follow along with the PowerPoint presentation, reading the text as you go and answering the test questions after each section. Whichever method you choose, print the answer and cover sheets before starting. When you have completed the answer sheet, send it to your current Department Leadership Chairman.
- 3. **Encourage Action.** Think about how you feel after you have done a good deed. Remember that feeling after spending time helping someone with a problem? These emotional "highs" help keep people feeling good about investing their time, resources, and efforts with the American Legion Auxiliary. Finding ways, both big and small, that members can support the mission of the ALA will capitalize on the excitement felt, which will positively impact a member's morale.

Hopefully, these three items, it will help you be strong leaders within the organization while growing future leaders!

Remember to submit your reports and start working on your end-of-year award entries!

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The National Executive Committee is working hard to make sure that the states are in compliance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the organization by appointing committees that are looking into the complaints that have been brought before us. #### NATIONAL AWARD SALUTE TO SERVICEWOMEN

There are several areas that must be met for this award. Refer to your POA pg 163-164 for the criteria. Please submit your entry no later than <u>May 1</u>, 2023.

#### DEPARTMENT AWARD THE SUSAN M. BRITTON AWARD

To the **Unit** and **County** National Security Chairman who submits the most outstanding report of overall National Security activities. Submit this entry no later than <u>May 1</u>, 2023.

Additional Programs to support military families, especially newer families to the military who are usually younger and could be the lower ranked military service members. Such as:

#### **Operation Homefront** –

Home on the Front – helps military families locate homes, usually they are first time buyers.

**Back to School Brigade** - helps partner with Dollar Tree to gather backpacks and supplies for school-age children.

**Holiday Meals for the Military –** this program works to provide holiday meals during Thanksgiving or Christmas.

Once the slate is presented, pay attention to how you are to conduct the elections. Ballot results should not be reported to the body in detail. There is no need to make the people who were willing to run but who lose feel embarrassed. Your goal is to get the best officers with the least amount of resentment. An election where everyone feels that they were heard and will be represented is the ideal.

Spring is a time of renewal. Let's work to make our units and counties welcoming to all. Membership is everyone's responsibility.
